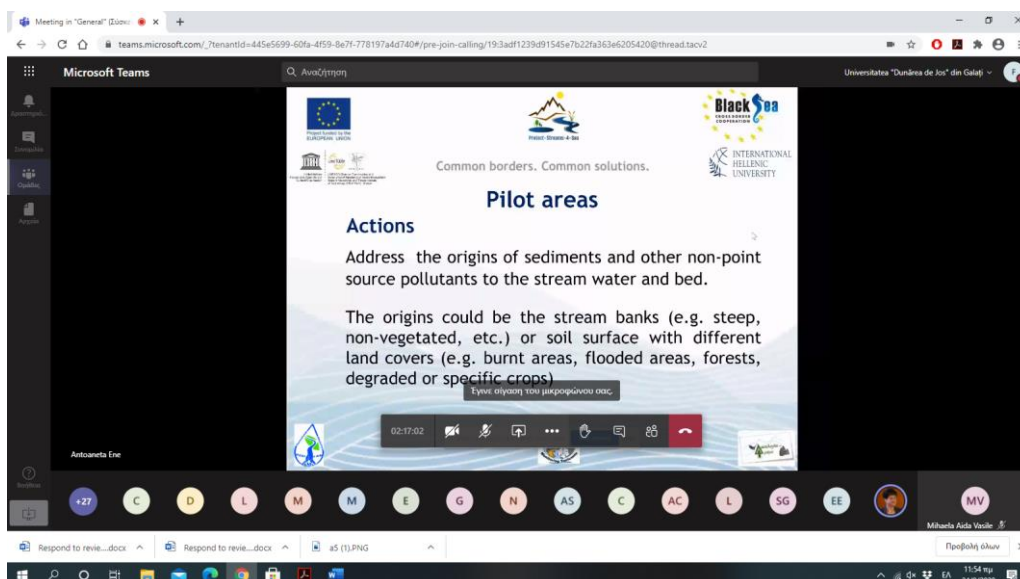

Presenting the BSB963 “Protect-Streams-4-Sea” Project

Valasia Iakovoglou was an invited lecturer to present the project at the MONITOX International Conference “Environmental Challenges in the Black Sea Basin: Impact on Human Health”, Galati, Romania, September 23rd-26th, 2020. The conference was held in person and online with Microsoft Teams.

The title of the presentation was “Nature-based solutions for streams to reduce sediment and litter pollution in the Black Sea.” The authors were Valasia Iakovoglou, Paschalis Koutalakis, Daniel Diaconu, Mustafa Tufekcioglu, Ilya Trombitsky, Andranik Ghulijanyan, Mirela Marinescu, Aydin Tufekcioglu, George N. Zaimes. All the project partners participated in the writing of the abstract.

The conference was held for the project BSB27-MONITOX “Black Sea Basin interdisciplinary cooperation network for sustainable joint monitoring of environmental toxicants migration, improved evaluation of ecological state and human health impact of harmful substances, and public exposure prevention” and organized by Dunarea de Jos University of Galati (UDJG), Romania that is the lead partner. In this conference there were 14 oral presentations and 27 poster presentations and it was attended by more than 60 participants.
